



FINANCIAL AID

Important!! If you want financial aid, all three steps below must be completed before you register. Otherwise, you will be asked for a minimum payment of 1/3 tuition (plus \$30 fee) or _ tuition (no fee) at that time. Please allow 6 weeks for processing. DO NOT WAIT until you have been admitted to apply. Remember to re-apply every school year!

How to Apply for Financial Aid

Step 1. COMPLETE THE FAFSA - Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- Apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov (fastest and easiest!) or by mail
- Be sure to request a PIN number and to include our school code, **E00556**

Step 2. COMPLETE THE AUSB FINANCIAL AID FORMS

You can obtain the AUSB Financial Aid Forms 3 ways:

- Pick them up from the Financial Aid Office when you're on campus
- Download them from our website
- Call the Financial Aid Office and ask they be mailed to you

Step 3. RETURN THESE FORMS TO THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

- Antioch Financial Aid Application Form
- Loan Maximums Form
- Entrance Interview Form**
- Master Promissory Note

**If this is your first quarter at Antioch, you are required to make an appointment for an Entrance Interview.

If your FAFSA is selected for Verification, you will need to provide last year's Federal Tax Return and W-2's, and complete a Verification Worksheet.

Financial Aid Cautions

All forms of financial aid are disbursed on a quarterly basis. Eligible students must be enrolled with at least a half-time status. Financial Aid awards may be drastically affected when students withdraw for a quarter, change from full to half-time status, or fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress. Please review the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for further information. Students planning changes in enrollment status, or who are experiencing academic difficulty should contact the Financial Aid Office to discuss the implications prior to change.

What Types of Financial Aid Are Available?

Federal Pell Grant - Federal grant that need not be repaid (for Undergraduate students only); based on financial need.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) - Federal grant that need not be repaid (for Undergraduate students only); based on financial need.

Cal Grant - State grant that need not be repaid (for Undergraduate students only); based on financial need and grade point average. Cal Grant recipients will also need to provide a copy of their award letter (CAR) from the California Student Aid Commission.

Antioch Tuition Grant (ATG) - Institutionally funded grant that need not be repaid; assigned based on financial need; must be on financial aid to qualify. These grants are intended to increase cultural diversity; based on financial need. Awards assigned through the Financial Aid Office.

Antioch Opportunity Grant (AOG) - Institutionally funded grant that need not be repaid; must be on financial aid to qualify. These grants are intended to increase cultural diversity; based on financial need. Awards assigned at the discretion of the Program Chair.

Federal Work-Study Program (FWSP) - The Federal Work-Study program is a campus-based aid program, providing job opportunities on campus, for students who have established financial need through the submission of the FAFSA. Students must be enrolled at least half-time and maintain satisfactory academic progress. The FWS salary is currently \$10 per hour. If interested, please submit a resume to the Financial Aid Office with your application forms.

Federal Perkins Loan - Low interest loan with delayed payback; based on financial need.

Federal Stafford Loans - A variable interest loan with delayed payback. Interest paid by the government while in school on Subsidized Loans; interest accruing while in school on Unsubsidized.
